 - c. Download a personal copy by clicking the ellipsis (the three dots) in the top right and choosing download.
 - d. Open the Downloads folder on your computer by either double clicking the blue pop-up box in the bottom right that appears when you download the file, OR navigate there using the file explorer.
 - e. Copy and Paste the Hiragana Chart Complete file to your desktop for future easy access.
 - f. Bonus: There is a second chart in the files you may also want to keep nearby that shows how to write the characters with the proper stroke order. That file is called *Hiragana Kakijun zenbu update*. We will use both along with the GIFS in the Content Library to learn how to write the characters over this course.
