6. Hiragana Writing Practice: Classwork Grade

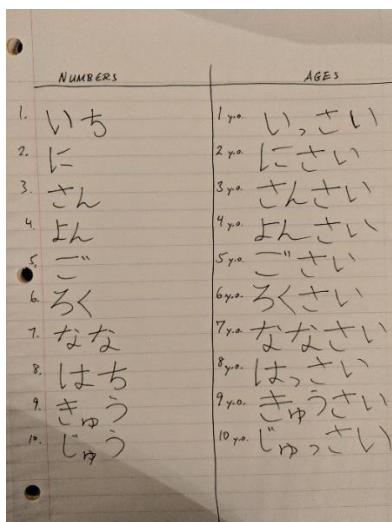
In your physical paper Japanese notebook, you are going to write the numbers and ages in Hiragana.
